



Public Right to make Representation to East Cowes Town Council

- a. Any member of the public wishing to make representation to the council on an item which is considered to be the business of this council, may speak at a council meeting (*prior to the start of the agenda*) for a period not exceeding three **(3)** minutes.
- b. Where a group of members of the public wishes to make representation on an item which is considered to be the business of the this council, and is listed on the agenda, they will be required to nominate a representative from among themselves, to speak for a maximum of three **(3)** minutes or longer at the discretion of the Mayor, to express the views of the group.
- c. The total time allowed for questions/representations by members of the public will not exceed 15 minutes. The Mayor reserves the right to limit the number of speakers on any given item of business and his/her decision will be final.
- d. If, after speaking for the allotted time, any member of the public or group persistently interrupts, the Mayor, after due warning to that person/s, may order that they be removed from the meeting and may adjourn the meeting for such a period as is necessary to restore order.



Public Right to make Representation to East Cowes Town Council
