Community Hub Project -Latest News!

THANK YOU to everyone who has already returned the community hub survey to the town hall. The Town Council has been very pleased will the response rate. If you have not done so yet you still have until 13th December to have your say. Why not drop it in when coming to vote in the general election!

The survey was delivered to every household in the town towards the end of October. It is part of the process of applying for a Public Works Loan to fund the project.

Public Works Loans are granted for capital projects and are for a long period at a low rate of interest.

The Town Council is thrilled to have secured, in principal, £100,000 of section 106 money which means that the amount required via a Public Works Loan will be much lower than initially planned.

Those of you who have been using the library since it moved in to a side room at the Town Hall back in April will appreciate that if the Community Hub project goes ahead you will have a larger, much lighter and more user friendly space than is possible in it's temporary home.

The library will become a more visible building and a focal point in the community.


The building will also house accessible ground floor offices for town council staff and a meeting room that will be available for hire and community use. The Osborne Road toilets will be replaced with more modern facilities.

The design of new buildings can be a controversial matter as everyone has their own view about what looks best. East Cowes is a town with an amazing past from it's royal connections through the Victorian era to its marine and boat building history.

Some of you may prefer to see an extension to the town hall built in a similar style to this but the town council is very pleased with the design that the architects have come up with.

It is hoped that the current design will highlight that as well as celebrating its past the town is looking forward to a bright future and can take a modern approach.

As well as the design cost is a consideration. A traditional style building similar to the town hall would be much more expensive. We now await the Planning Authority's decision on whether this project can go ahead.



Hope you like to look of the new town map. The Town Council has been working with a local artist to produce an eye catching map that shows what the town has to offer.

It is hoped that local people and visitors alike will find this useful and it will encourage them to use all tha facilities and amenities that are on offer.

Those of you with historical interests might want to visit the Classic Boat Museum, the Heritage Centre and Osborne House which are easy to pick out.

You might like to follow the trail from the town up to Osborne House and tread in the footprints of figures from history who made the same journey.

There many green spaces and recreational areas to enjoy. Why not walk along the Esplanade or visit a play area or the outdoor gym?

Perhaps you could make a New Years Resolution to explore what's right on your doorstep or get out and about with family and friends over the festive season!



Looking back to sunny summer days East Cowes Town Council supported The John Cattle Skate Club with a grant of £700. This enabled them to run a programme of skate boarding sessions for 2-15 year olds. 87 youngsters attended over the 5 weeks. Participation was up 74% from 2017!

The number of girls taking part was also up - they made up 33% of the group. 18% attended 2 or more sessions.
