Mayor's Report

Hello to all the residents of East Cowes. For those of you who do not already know me, I am Tracy Reardon, and I would like to introduce myself to you as the new Mayor of East Cowes. I'm extremely excited to represent the council and community and to promote our wonderful town.



I would like to thank my fellow councillors for their support and their acknowledgment that I will endeavour to represent the Council whilst always championing East Cowes and its residents. I have been involved in various volunteering organisations in the business and community sector in East Cowes for a number of years. As a business owner, secretary of the East Cowes Business Association and chairman of the East Cowes Community Partnership, I felt that the

next step for me would be to become a local councillor and was consequently elected in May 2021. I am looking forward to this new challenge and working with a wider team of likeminded people that share the same goal. To celebrate East Cowes' heritage and future, which makes our community passion exactly why everyone pulls together to make it the town where we all love to live!

There are many occasions and anniversaries coming up in 2022 which will allow the community to come together and mark these occasions. The Town Hall will be the focal point for many of these.

From Friday 29th April to Friday 6th May the 80th Anniversary of the Blitz and the role of the Polish Naval ship the ORP Blyskawica in saving lives in East Cowes will be marked with an exhibition, talk and concert by the Polish naval band.

Plans are also currently coming together to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee over the extended bank holiday weekend Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June. Keep an eye out on the Town Council website, Facebook Page, and noticeboards for updates.

A mature rowan tree is to be planted at the Jubilee Recreation Ground as part of the Queens Green Canopy initiative, and an official commemorative plaque, produced by the Royal British Legion veterans, will mark this. If you would like to have the honour of completing the planting of the tree for this unique occasion it's time to get creative. One of the policies that came out of the Town Plan was the development of a market in the town. Plans are currently underway for a monthly market to take place in the town hall or from time to time on the Esplanade. Hopefully the first one will be happening in May.



I hope as many of you as possible will be able to enjoy these events as well as all the regular activities happening in the town hall. We have an exciting year ahead.

Community Hub Update

There has been excellent progress on the new Community Hub and Library building. The shell of the building is close to completion and the interior layout is starting to take shape. Everything is still on track for opening in June 2022.

Plans for the perimeter will include a low brick wall with railings on top which will replicate how this looked when the town hall was first built. Due to the difference in levels alongside the outside seating area there will be a wall with planting providing a colourful and welcoming frontage. As you can see from the photo (above right) the plant room is being constructed in the corridor which joins the two buildings together. The remaining space will be used for storing tables and chairs.

No increase in the Town Council precept!

The Town Council have been working very hard to develop a budget that will mean there will be no increase in your precept (the town council's share of the Council Tax) for the coming year.

The Council have recently taken on additional responsibilities from the Isle of Wight Council, including the facilities at the Esplanade, Jubilee Recreation Ground and Victoria Grove, and are tackling some big projects, such as the new Community Hub and upgrading the Skatepark. But with some very careful housekeeping we have managed to keep the precept at the same rate as 2021/22.



The new Community Hub & Library will be opening this year and we hope that it will become the focal point for the community and will provide a place to meet old and new friends.

We hope to develop lots more community projects and have recently introduced a community cinema at the Town Hall – run by volunteers and are currently making plans for an all-weather market for crafts, local producers, and artisans.

We will be organising and supporting lots of events for the Queens Platinum Jubilee this year, so keep an eye on our Facebook page, noticeboards, and website for more news!

Bathing Water Quality in East Cowes

Several members of the East Cowes Community have been campaigning to have East Cowes beach accredited with bathing water quality status. Over many months water samples have been collected by volunteers and sent off for testing. The Town Council has been funding and supporting this work. Once bathing water quality status has been achieved DEFRA will take over the water testing at their cost. The next stage is for a noticeboard to be installed in conjunction with the Isle of Wight Council. This will be sited near the bottom of Cambridge Road. Notices will be posted advising bathers of any issues with the water quality during the bathing season.
